HOAs protect and maintain HOA property values

HOA Board Leaders:

- 1. Govern
 - Apply laws and governing documents to oversee the HOA

2. Manage finances

- Collect assessments from homeowners
- Purchase services and fund reserves
- 3. Promote community of homeowners
 - Act and communicate for participation and cooperation



HOA Governing Documents

- 1. Create the HOA as a non-profit corporation
- 2. Legally bind homeowners to their HOA
- 3. Give boards authority and duty to govern and manage finances
- 4. Describe homeowner duties and rights
- 5. Detail meetings, elections, maintenance, grievances and more
- 6. Permit rules and regulations
- 7. Can't conflict with federal and state laws and local ordinances



HOA Governing Documents

Plat Map

- HOA fundamental legal real estate record
- Included properties
- Property descriptions
- Amenities and infrastructure





HOA Governing Documents – a heirarchy

Declaration

- Purpose of HOA
- Included property
- Common elements
- Binds homeowners
- Assessments
- Insurance
- Use restrictions

Articles of Incorporation

- Creates HOA
- Board of Directors
- Budgeting
- Assessments
- Architectural control
- Maintenance

Bylaws

- Board duties
- Meetings
- Elections
- Grievance



HOA Governing Documents

Rules and Regulations

- Boards adopt, change, and remove at board meetings
- Clarify governing documents
- Respond to emerging concerns
- Are needed, within board scope, reasonable, and enforceable
- Cannot conflict with laws and governing documents
- Can restrict homeowner behavior and lead to conflicts



HOA Governing Documents - Homeowner Protections

- 1. Provide for collection of operating funds and reserve funds
- 2. Define board fiduciary duties and scope of authority
- 3. Provide for HOA meetings and board elections
- 4. Allocate maintenance, repair, and replacement responsibilities
- 5. Provide master insurance
- 6. Enable architectural control of unit exteriors and common areas
- 7. Enable rules and regulations
- 8. Establish grievance procedure



HOA Governing Documents – Homeowner Barriers

- 1. Outdated documents
- 2. Unreasonable restrictions
- 3. Lack modern provisions
- 4. Board may create unreasonable rules or unfairly enforce rules
- 5. Board may misinterpret or not follow
- 6. Board may act without authority

Recommendations

- 1. Codify Minnesota HOA board leader education
- 2. Codify Minnesota HOA homeowner grievance mechanism
- 3. Promote certification of Minnesota HOA association managers
- 4. Strengthen HOA registration in Minnesota Secretary of State
- 5. Strengthen regulatory oversight of Minnesota HOA insurance
