LEGISLATIVE ISSUES FROM STAKEHOLDERS

- 1. Voluntary private well testing
- 2. Water safety plans for cities— a pilot
- 3. Water Retention—Urban Storm
- 4. Improved Water and Agriculture
- 5. Tax credit for private riparian buffer lands
- 6. Change water highest priority water allocation priorities to include Schools and Hospitals

KEEP OUR LAKES CLEAN INITIATIVE

- 1. Lake use has changed --winter has become a popular time for recreation
- 2. Lakes have become recreational vehicle campgrounds
- 3. No rules or services for trash and human waste
- 4. DNR to coordinate outreach, develop a grant program to prevent water pollution
- 5. Bi-partisan support: Reps Skraba, Hemmingsen-Jaeger and Sen Putnam

REDUCE SALT USE- SAVE OUR LAKES

- 1. Salt applicator-- voluntary certification and limited liability
- 2. Requires training and certification
- 3. Bi-partisan support: Sen Putnam, Reps Fischer and Hemmingsen-Jaeger

WATER ALLOCATION PROCESS

- 1. Changes highest water allocation priorities to include schools and hospitals
- 2. White Bear Lake" Judges order identified this problem
- 3. History, 2024: Rep Fischer introduced the house bill

LAKE AND STREAM PROTECTION IN THE UPPER MISSISSIPPI

- 1. Provides policy and plans to protect our most highly valued waters
- 2. DNR-- maintaining 75 % of forestland is critical for water quality
- 3. This would also protect the source for our drinking water in the Metro
- 4. Initiative focuses on priority lakes and streams located in the Upper Miss
- 5. Supports CWC's goal of protecting 100,000 acres of private forestland
- 6. Sets aside \$8m/yr over 10 years to complete the plan
- 7. 50-50 split, half the 90,000 acres protected with conservation easements
- 8. The rest, protected by the Sustainable Forest Incentives Act (DNR)
- 9. Request is for \$5 M to begin the process and increase private forested
- 10. Introduced in both bodies in 2024: HF1394;SF2192;Rep Fischer/ Sen McEwen

TAX CREDIT FOR PRIVATE RIPARIAN BUFFER LANDS

- 1. Provide a tax credit to landowners for riparian buffer lands taken out of agriculture
- 2. Supported in the past, including Rep Fischer and Sen Weber

RED RIVER WATER STORAGE

- 1. Minnesota needs to make an investment to address flooding in the Red River Valley
- 2. Need is \$271 million over the next 10 YEARS
- 3. Local funding to the RRWMB needs to be increased and maintained at a two-mil levy
- 4. Sponsor: RRWMB

ENHANCED GROUNDWAER RECHARGE

- 1. Legislature funded a feasibility about expanded groundwater recharge
- 2. Policy and funding is needed to encourage recharge where needed
- 3. Bi-partisan support in the past including Sen Kupec" Reps Rehm, Hemmingsen- Jaeger, Fischer and Skraba: HF1392

VOLUNTARY PRIVATE WELL TESTING

- 1. Water from domestic wells needs to be safe
- 2. Allocation to MDH/UM to support private well water testing clinics by non -profits
- 3. 2023: BI-partisan support included Rep Fischer and Sen Morrison

AQUATIC INVASIVE SPECIES FUNDING

- 1. Great need for funding to manage and to control invasive aquatic plants
- 2. Ask is to supplement contributions from local governments for AIS--education
- 3. Sponsor: Minnesota Lakes and Rivers

WAKE SURFING ISSUES AND CONTROVERSY

- 1. Addresses the growing popularity of wake surfing
- 2. Problem: conflicts and environmental concerns
- 3. Examples: erosion, damage to docks, and ecological disturbances
- 4. St Anthony Fall Lab has conducted research on impacts
- 5. The focus is on impacts and educating the public and local ordinances
- 6. Will result in guidelines for wake surfing
- 7. Support for educational programs is needed
- 8. Sponsor: Minnesota Lakes and Rivers

ESTABLISH A MINNESOTA RIVER BOARD

- 1. A new structure is needed to ensure government accountability and citizen participation in meeting Minnesota River cleanup goals
- 2. The citizens' advisory committee proposes the creation of the Minnesota river commission
- 3. Commission would not be involved in the day-to-day operations of agencies
- 4. Would be accountable to the governor and the Legislature
- 5. Details about the proposal and the proposed organization are on the subcommittee website
- 6. I've discussed with non-partisan staff, and they suggest that details need to be worked out before a bill could be prepared.
- 7. Suggesting that a process, with help from the subcommittee, be initiated to prepare a bill for consideration at the next session
